- 1. The abstract starts with a clear statement about the development of halal as a lifestyle for many Muslims, which is engaging and relevant to the topic. However, the abstract lacks a structured format. It would be beneficial to organize the abstract into distinct sections to provide a more systematic overview of the study.
- 2. The study briefly mentions the objective of the research, which is to create a new paradigm in the halal supply chain in the catering industry. However, it could benefit from a more detailed explanation of the specific goals or questions that the research aims to address.
- 3. The literature review introduces the concept of halal supply chain management, which is appropriate given the study's focus. It highlights the importance of ensuring that halal standards are met in the supply chain. However, the connection to the catering industry could be made more explicit.
- 4. The article mentions that the research focuses only on "Diamond" catering companies in Jakarta. While this indicates the scope, it would be helpful to briefly explain why this specific company was chosen and whether the findings can be generalized to the broader catering industry.
- 5. The reference to the Pew Research Center study is useful for providing context about the Muslim population's growth. However, the article could expand on this information to show

how it directly relates to the research on halal supply chains in catering.

Reviewer B

While the manuscript provides a general introduction to the research topic, it should also maintain a clear structure to make it easier for readers to understand the main points. Additionally, the revision of the following key areas would enhance clarity.

- 1. While the article highlights the importance of ensuring halal compliance in catering, it doesn't clearly state why this research is significant or what practical implications it may have for the industry.
- 2. The literature review section begins by defining supply chain management (SCM), which is a standard practice in academic writing. However, the definitions provided are somewhat standard and do not add a new dimension to the discussion. It would be beneficial to delve deeper into the concept of SCM or to provide specific examples of how it's relevant to the research.
- 3. The Research Design section appropriately describes the research design as "descriptive qualitative." It references an academic source to support this choice, which adds credibility to the methodology. The section provides a concise explanation of qualitative research, its philosophy, and its characteristics. However, it could benefit from a more direct statement of why a qualitative approach was chosen for this specific research.
- 4. The discussion section provides a reasonable discussion on the dimensions of food quality, distinguishing between objective and subjective elements. However, the connection to the overall research context could be made more explicit. How do these dimensions relate to halal supply chains in catering? The text should provide a clearer link.
- 5. The distinction between purity and quality is relevant to halal products, but the text could provide specific examples or cases to illustrate the thin line between the two. This would make the discussion more concrete and relatable to the reader.
