ABSTRACT

Title : Review of Completeness Informed Consent

in Cengkareng Regional General Hospital

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Study Program: D-III Medical Record and Health Information

The hospital is part of the health service facility as a place for organizing health services used for medical and dental practice, when practicing medicine, a doctor or dentist creates a medical record. Medical records must be made in writing, complete and clear, including informed consent Cengkareng Hospital has conducted a quantitative analysis for the completeness of its medical records, but for informed consent the whole variable was not analyzed only on certain variables, namely diagnosis, medical action, doctor's signature, patient's signature, witness's signature, no marks, no tipp ex, nothing is not recorded. This research is to find out the completeness informed consent at Cengkareng Regional Hospital. This type of research is quantitative descriptive with cross sectional approach. Data collection is done by observation and interview. This research was conducted in the medical record unit of Cengkareng Regional Hospital, West Jakarta. Based on the results of this study there is no standard operating procedures specifically for completeness of the informed consent. The results of the study are based on quantitative analysis of 100 samples of medical records of surgery patients on the completeness of informed consent with an average completeness of the four components of information provision of 54.32%. The highest completeness was in the author's authentication of 71%, the most incomplete in the completeness of the important reports was 60.73% while in the approval of medical measures the completeness was 83.36%. The highest completeness is in the important report completeness 98.29% and the most incomplete is authentication/recording validity of 32.91%.
