

## ABSTRACT

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**Program Study** : Public Health  
**Title** : *Factors Related to Patient Safety Behavior by Nurses in the Inpatient Room of Siloam Lippo Village Hospital in 2018*

*Patient safety is a top priority for hospitals and this is related to the issue of quality and image of the hospital. There are several indicators in Siloam Lippo Village Hospital that have not yet reached the target. The purpose of this study was to determine the factors related to the behavior of the implementation of patient safety by nurses in the inpatient ward of Siloam Lippo Village in 2018. This type of research is quantitative with a cross sectional research design. Data collection is done using a questionnaire. The population in this study were 167 nurses in the inpatient room. Data analysis using univariate and bivariate analysis. The results of the Chi-Square test showed no relationship between age ( $p$ -value= 0,0,72) and education last ( $p$ -value= 0,209) with the behavior of applying patient safety. The test results showed a significant relationship between years of service ( $p$ -value=0,001), knowledge ( $p$ -value= 0,014) and attitudes ( $p$ -value=<0,001) with the behavior of applying patient safety. With so advised nurses can minimize patient safety errors by increasing knowledge and attitudes in implementing patient safety.*
