ABSTRACT

The background of this research is the parents' concern about the information obtained by their children. The development of time and technology makes it easier for children to access various kinds of information. Parents are worried about negative information that can affect the child's self. The ability to think critically is needed to filter and examine the extent of the truth of the news or information because if the information is not critically examined in advance it will have an unfavorable impact on children. The purpose of this study was to determine the efforts made by parents in developing children's critical thinking skills.
