ABSTRACT

CKD is a state of progressive and irreversible kidney function change, in which the kidneys are unable to maintain fluid balance and accumulation of metabolic waste resulting in end-stage renal disease. Various clinical manifestations can be experienced by CKD patients due to elevated levels of urea in the blood, one of which is gastrointestinal disorders nausea vomiting. Objective: This case study is to identify nursing care in each patient with CKD disease in the 3rd floor Public Health Care Room of RSPAD Gatot Soebroto Central Jakarta Year 2017. In writing the final report of this case study the author uses descriptive method (with nursing process approach) And literary methods (with literature tracking). Characteristics of patients who are respondents to case studies of CKD disease are on average 60 years of age, the majority of classification of CKD clients in stage V and already undergo hemodialysis program. Nursing problems in CKD clients are excess fluid volume, changes in breathing patterns, nutrient imbalances less than body requirements, activity intolerance and peripheral tissue perfusion ineffectiveness. From the results of case studies that the authors found were Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD) patients undergoing hemodialysis therapy generally complained of nausea and vomiting due to increased waste of metabolic waste in the body of urea and creatinine circulating in the blood and can not get out of the body. Increased levels of urea and cretainin can stimulate the production of stomach acid resulting in complaints such as gastritis and nausea and vomiting, estimated to occur in 70-90% of hemodialysis patients. Inhaling lemon aromatherapy is one of the treatments that can be administered to CKD patients who feel nausea and vomiting. It is suggested to RSPAD Gatot Soebroto to make SOP in the use of lemon aromatherapy to overcome nausea and vomiting of patient with CKD.
