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ANALYSIS OF NURSING CARE IN PATIENTS WITH DENGUE HEMORRAGIC FEVER (DHF) OF RSPAD GATOT SOEBROTO 2020.

ABSTRACT

Dengue Hemorrhagic Fever (DHF) or commonly known as Dengue Hemorrhagic Fever (DHF) is a disease caused by dengue virus infection which is transmitted through the bite of Aedes aegepty mosquitoes which can trigger fever or hyperthermia. Jakarta is the second city after Bali which accounts for the highest DHF incidence in Indonesia. The intensity of rain and erratic weather in the DKI Jakarta area, causes a high number of potential health problems for the community, especially Dangue Dengue Fever (DHF). Writing this scientific paper using the case study method on 2 clients, in the form of comprehensive nursing care. The results showed a diagnosis of the risk of lack of fluid volume, hyperthermia and the risk of nutritional imbalances less than the body's needs. Case study results show that almost all clients are still children and DHF is caused by dengue virus. It is expected that medical staff will be able to provide guidance and counseling about DHF and how to handle it.
